

1. 3382 Old Weymouth Mrs Stephenson's boarding house many years. Site of the village's first orchard.
2. 3386 OW House built 1820. At right was a Methodist church 1840-1906, dance hall 1915-1936, then Scanlan's basket factory.
3. 3388 OW Temperance Hall, then grades 1 through 8 from 1862-1925.
4. 3389 OW Mrs Hunt's house was originally down over the hill, moved up in 1905 after she was trapped in a flood.
5. 3394 OW Smedley family educated daughters as well as their sons. Mary a noted metalsmith & jeweler; Jennie was educator, writer, & abolitionist.
6. Weymouth church, the oldest church in the county. Listed on national Historic American Buildings Survey. Strongly antislavery.
7. 3327 Frantz Rd Fannie Worden, village midwife and rented rooms to elderlies and teachers
8. 3131 Remsen 1881 Paul Wustenburg wounded in the face by a sword at war in Germany then served our Civil War.
9. 3067 Built in 1820 by farmer and Civil War veteran John and Chloe Briggs
10. 3055 Built by carpenter David Young in 1872. Wife Fronie lived to 93. She left a diary telling much about daily life here.
11. 3314 Myers School 1925-1955. Ohio's first tax-supported school for special needs children 1960. Restored by the WPS 2012.
12. 3313 1829 school house, then became a house in 1872. Until 1935 it had no plumbing, furnace or electricity.
13. 3356 Used as World War I Red Cross room; women knitted care packages for the soldiers.
14. 3378 OW built 1840. A store here had the post office and dance hall.
15. 3376 OW Weymouth general store built 1850, Weymouth pantry closed 1989.
16. 3305 Myers Third Weymouth school built 1840, stonemasons shop in 1910, now a home.
17. Cemetery Originally the Heacox family plot in 1826, many early area settlers.
18. 3344 OW 1840. One huge beam supports the entire length, exposed beams inside.
19. 3352 OW The roof was raised to turn this into a two-story house in 1897. John Einhart was stone mason, bridge builder, and school janitor. 20.
- 3365 OW Home of Rev John Seymour. Weymouth Church minister. He & his wife were Native American missionaries many years.
21. 3395 Nichols a house, then garage then a house again in 1941.
22. 3405 Nichols Built in 1859 by carpenter Wm "Chipper" Heacox.
23. 3345 OW 1838. Jay Einhart in 1940s was county auditor, fair director & sold pre-fab homes. Wife Ethel was a champion baker.
24. 3306 Gingerbread house 1851 by lumberman Wm Seymour. Kitchen, bay window and iron fence added 1882.
25. 3284 Dr Young's house 1872. The village doctor served in the Civil War & was a taxidermist.
26. 3282 Beckers' gas station 1930-1972. Teen Craig Staufer painted a mural of Weymouth as it looked c. 1874.
27. 3287 David & Mary Jane Hamlin & children Rialto, Romanti, Roland, Romaine, Rocelia, and Romulus lived here 1857-1874.
